### 4. Fees for Intervention.

No recent FFI activity amongst the group present

Recent incidents discussed

GS. A recent accident involving a Marshall 4 ton tractor trailer, involving entrapment and amputation of finger whilst attempting to open tailgate. Lack of adequate maintenance of equipment may have contributed to harm incurred HSE investigation ongoing

JB. Refuse operative struck by glancing blow from speeding vehicle

Service reviewing route risk assessments around single / double sided collections

JB Fire in a school

Procedural weaknesses, control of contractors, hot work permits, evacuation arrangements and alarm re-setting contributed to a unsatisfactory evacuation

School playground drain cover rotated as 6 year old child stood on top

Child very nearly fell into base of deep drain No evident regime of inspection and maintenance of gully infrastructure, resulted in crumbling mortar weakening cover frame

Schools generic risk assessments revised to incorporate external fixtures and fittings including manhole covers

Questions arose around Gully Squad's repairs and maintenance features of SLA's

GS. Nationally, Occupational Health provider fined for inadequate resources

SS Discussed Apprenticeship Levy

GS Discussed noise in refuse and recycling.

Recent survey indicates levels of exposure higher than previously recorded over 8 hour period

KC Experienced high levels of exposure uncharacteristically from Green Waste collections, due to vegetation 'screeching' whilst being compacted in vehicles, balancing protection afforded against ambient noise

GS Pupil injured due to other pupils fighting in a school

GS Highlighted a recent case where a <u>Head Teacher</u> banned from teaching for life, for falsifying a Fire Log Book. Ban due to dishonesty
