# AGILE PROJECT MANAGEMENT

### Introduction

This one-day learning module will provide participants with the project management approach and governance arrangements that will help any project in becoming successful.

**Agile** is an umbrella term over several project management approaches that are characterized by their ability to allow project teams to respond to changing requirements and priorities by using incremental work packages.

While all agile methods have common characteristics, each agile method has unique processes that set it apart.

Scrum (incorporating Sprint) is the most recognised Agile method and one of the most popular Agile methodologies employed in public sector organisations.

It is suitable for any project, even highly complex ones and it works by dividing up the complex aspects so that they can be easily managed.

The Agile approach allows flexibility by being both pragmatic and robust enough to cover all typical projects. This flexibility is essential to the success of all projects.
