

North East Joint (Members and Officers) Scrutiny Network – Working Terms of Reference

Purpose of the Network

- (a) To provide a forum for elected members who have a role within the scrutiny function to meet, make useful contacts with other members and officers, and to share 'experiences'.
- (b) To provide a mechanism to share information on, for example: scrutiny best practice; outcomes of scrutiny investigations; benchmarking; service planning; performance indicators; conference feedback and funding streams.
- (c) To share ideas on improving scrutiny processes and enhancing effectiveness.
- (d) To provide a mechanism to facilitate personal and professional development.
- (e) To provide a conduit between the North East authorities and the Centre for Public Scrutiny for sharing up-to-date information, this would include inviting speakers to talk about recent national policy developments.

Objectives

- (a) Establish an annual conference of the North East Regional Employers' Organisation Scrutiny Officers' Network (subject to successful funding bid).
- (b) To provide a forum for members of the network to make useful contacts with other scrutiny members and officers in the region.
- (c) To consider and develop action learning sets through the network as and when appropriate.
- (d) To develop facilities for peer reviews through the network as and when appropriate.
- (e) To enhance scrutiny member and officer training and development opportunities throughout the network.
- (f) Increase the use of the NEREO website and incorporate a library of scrutiny information, contact list, and examples of joint working onto this.
- (g) Provide a forum for the development of joint working in relation to: reviews; commissioning; research; and training.
- (h) Establish links between the network and other bodies such as the Centre for Public Scrutiny and other regional scrutiny networks.
- (i) Invite academics, professionals, representatives of government and other public sector organisations to share research/information that might impact on scrutiny with the network.
- (j) Develop 'responsive' sessions responding to 'current' issues as and when appropriate.
